Phase I - Equitable Access to Effective Educators District Diagnostic

Introduction

National data show that poor and minority students, English Language Learners and students with disabilities continue to be taught more often than their peers by inexperienced, out-of-field or ineffective teachers. As a result, the United States Department of Education (USDE) required states to develop equity plans and use evidence based strategies to address this issue. Kentucky's plan is focused on teacher preparation; recruitment, hiring and placement of teachers; providing supports for on-going, job-embedded professional learning; and strategies to retain teacher and leaders.

All districts and schools in Kentucky are required to identify barriers and develop strategies to address these issues to achieving equitable access to effective educators for students most at risk. This is being incorporated within the Comprehensive District and School Improvement Plans. Adair County is a rural district and there is a limited number of minority candidates who apply for jobs in this school district. The ELL student population has grown over the past decade and we are actively pursuing a teaching candidate with ELL certification. There has been a large number of teachers retire from our district in the past five years, contributing to the 18% who have less than four years of experience. However, retention rates are very high. Only two teachers left the district last year as a result of seeking employment elsewhere.

The one teacher who is out-of-field is an MSD teacher and we have difficulty finding teachers with that certification. This teacher holds a degree for LBD and is almost finished with her MSD degree.

After the data analysis is complete, the district will then identify the barriers (challenges) for some of the identified trends. An identified barrier, for example, could be higher teacher turnover in priority schools as compared with non-priority schools. Once the barriers have been identified, then root causes of why the barriers exist will be included.

Assessments with Technology - Adair County High School students will complete End of Course (EOC) Assessments online to demonstrate mastery of content. Adair County Middle and High School students will complete the Individual Learning Plans (ILP). Students in all schools will be tested online utilizing MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) testing 3 times per year which will provide a means for teachers and administrators to track individual student progress and target academic needs of individual students for increased student achievement. Students in grades 8 and 12 will complete technology literacy assessments as outlined in technology plan. Students will complete assessments in CIITS. The KOSSA test is administered to Career and Technical Education students to determine mastery. ACT, ASVAB, Work Keys, and any other online assessment that is required of our students will be completed.

Teacher & Administrator Technology Proficiency Assessment - All teachers and administrators are required to complete a technology proficiency assessment to ensure mastery of the ISTE National Teacher Technology Standards, which Kentucky's standards are based upon. Learning.com's "WayFind" Teacher Technology Assessment is administered to all teachers and administrators on a 3-year cycle to ensure that they keep abreast of technology skills and new technologies that are relevant to K-12 education. In Spring 2015, all teachers and administrators were assessed. In 2016 and 2017, only those teachers that were not proficient are reassessed, plus any new-hires in those years. The "Wayfind" assessment is aligned to ISTE Teacher Technology Standards and provide district and school leadership with meaningful data for analysis and for planning meaningful professional development for staff in regard to their individual assessment scores. Those staff who are not proficient will complete professional development activities that are designed to increase their technology proficiency.

Phase I - Needs Assessment

Introduction

The data is analyzed to ascertain how well students are performing academically, which ones need additional supports, which areas of the curriculum need work, how well teachers are meeting student growth targets and professional growth targets, how well the district is meeting the needs of all stakeholders-students, parents, community, etc.

The data shows:

- Curriculum changes have been effective because student performance has improved and more students are meeting benchmarks
- More students are graduating high school either college or career ready
- Based on the TELL survey and ValEd, school culture and climate have improved district wide
- The graduation rate has improved and the dropout and retention rates have been reduced
- There are still gaps among all non-duplicated gap groups at all schools
- High school students are not scoring at the proficient level on end-of-course tests at a high enough level
- Kindergarten readiness has improved from about 33% ready to around 50% ready, but that number is still too low

The data does not tell us:

- How to reach students who are not ready for kindergarten because the ones we are missing are the ones who are not attending any kind of public preschool, Head Start, or daycare program
- How to reduce the gaps for all students, even when we implement a variety of intervention strategies

Areas of Strengths

What were the areas of strength you noted? What actions are you implementing to sustain the areas of strength? What is there cause to celebrate?

Areas of strength:

- Graduation rate of 99.4%
- Dropout rate of .1%
- Retention rate of .6%
- Improved test scores in all schools

In order to sustain the areas of strength, we will continue Early Release Fridays in order to allow staff to analyze student performance, curriculum decisions, professional development, etc. We will continue monitoring the progress at all schools by continuing monthly Focus Team Meetings with school leadership, conducting instructional rounds and walk throughs, and monitoring lesson plans and assessment data.

There is cause to celebrate because this is the first time ever that all schools have reached proficient status in the same year and the graduation rate is at an all time high. High school students have more opportunities than ever before because they can enroll in the Indian Academy for credit recovery, acceleration, and remediation, or they can take advantage of Indian University and earn college credit and dual credit. Many are able to take advantage of the Dual Credit Scholarships offered by the state. Students also have more career pathways available to them than ever before.

Kindergarten readiness has improved due to innovative ideas such as the Born Learning Academy initiative.

Adair County Primary/Adair County Elementary raised test scores by more than 12 points and Adair County Middle School raised test scores by more than eight points.

Opportunities for Improvement

What were areas in need of improvement? What plans are you making to improve the areas of need?

Areas where improvement is needed include kindergarten readiness, reducing the novice rate, and closing the achievement gaps for all students and all non-duplicated gaps.

The district will continue the use of Early Release Fridays, data teams, Focus Team meetings, instructional rounds and walk throughs, monitoring of PGES, lesson plans and assessments as a way to sustain improvements already made. Work will continue on standards as new standards are put in place for science and social studies and the new accountability system evolves.

Oversight and Monitoring

All students at all schools receive interventions or acceleration as needed. Progress monitoring is done by staff and each school has a curriculum resource teacher assigned to hone in on student data and data analysis.

District staff meet regularly with school staff to look at what is being done, what is working and where improvements are needed.

The Adair County School District is a rural school district located in southcentral Kentucky, with an enrollment of approximately 2600 students. The population of Adair County is just over 18,000 and the county seat is Columbia, KY. The district is comprised of four schools on one campus-Adair County High School (9-12), Adair County Middle School (6-8) , Adair County Elementary School (3-5), and Adair County Primary Center (K-2). Preschool students attend a separate preschool center housed inside Adair County Elementary.

There is a state funded juvenile detention center, Adair Youth Development Center, along with some residential, therapeutic facilities in the district.

The district's student population is predominantly Caucasian, with minorities representing about 11% of the population; 68% of the students are economically disadvantaged.

There are about equal numbers of males and females attending school in Adair County. The average spending per pupil per year is \$10,297; average daily attendance is 94.7%. The district's Transition to Adult Life (where students are after PK-12 education) show 73% successfully transition to college, 66% to the work force (some working and attending college), 4% enter the military, 11% are engaged in vocational/technical training, and 17% are unsuccessful. The most recent graduation rate was 99.4%, the highest percentage in many years.

Programs offered in addition to the core academic programs are academic recovery, extended school services, Title I, gifted education, special education services, migrant identification and services, courses for college credit, dual credit, AP, Response to Intervention, FRYSC, homebound, speech services, KDE transitional courses and more. The district also employs a school psychologist.

There are currently a total of 171 teachers employed in the Adair County School District, with the average years of experience being 13.8 years. Adair County has 16 National Board Certified Teachers and 22.8% of the teachers have a bachelor's degree, 31.5% have a master's degree and 45.7% of the teachers have a Rank I degree.

-The district's Academic Teams (all grade levels) have consistently garnered top honors at district, regional and state competitions and have set records for the number of titles they have won. They also compete nationally and even internationally and bring home high team honors, as well as individual titles.

-The Adair County Band has been KMEA State Champion: 1986,1987,1988,1989,1990, 1991,1992,1993,1994,1995, 1997,1999, 2000, 2001, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011; 2015 Bands of America Class A National Champion: 2005, 2007; 2014, 2015; Bands of America Regional Champion: 2007; and a Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade participant 2009.

-The Adair County baseball team won district championships in 2013-14 and 2014-15.

-All schools in the district were Proficient/Progressing in 2016-17. The district overall was Proficient/Progressing and was also labeled a High Progress District.

Areas for improvement: continued improvement in College and Career Readiness, reduce gaps in reading and math for all students, school safety, increased parental and community involvement, maintain high graduation rate, and continued incorporation of Ciits for assessments and lesson planning. The district added additional career pathways in aerospace through the National Aerospace Institute and Junior ROTC. EMT classes will begin at Adair County High School in January, 2017.

The district is continuing to forge partnerships with community partners such as local colleges and universities, the Lake Cumberland Area Development District, the local Chamber of Commerce (Work Ready Community Initiative), city and county government and others. An additional partnership with Western Kentucky University's Confucius Institute has brought two Chinese language teachers into the district.

Recently completed projects are the satellite vocational campus at Adair County High School (welding and health sciences) and new awnings to cover walkways at ACES and ACPC. The technology infrastructure has been rebuilt to allow greater capacity for adding more technology devices. A campus-wide lighting project and new landscaping have also been completed. A new bus garage was completed in 2016.

All students are receiving free meals under the CEP Program.

A new satellite campus of the Lake Cumberland Area Technology Center at ACHS, adding health science classes that lead to certification in the health care field for high school students once they graduate and welding classes that lead to certification in tig, mig and plasma welding was begun in the summer of 2014 and completed in 2015. Both programs are now fully functional and enrollments in both programs are at full capacity.

ACHS students can currently earn Work Ready seals on their diplomas if they meet the program's guidelines under Adair County's Work Ready Community in Progress designation.

Adair County is sharing in a \$40 million dollar Race to the Top grant awarded to members of the Green River Regional Education Cooperative (GRREC) that allows districts to improve teaching and learning. The district is implementing many of the very innovative ideas and strategies outlined in the grant such as flexible scheduling, standards-based grading practices, the formation of data teams and professional learning teams in schools and in the district. All schools in the district have fully implemented the Covey Institute's Leader in Me program and the Adair County district's new focus is on "Just Lead."

Two schools, Adair County Primary Center (K-2) and Adair County Elementary (PK, 3-5), are currently serving students in after school programs funded through a 21st Century grant.

All of Adair County's schools are now school wide Title I programs.
